



PROCEDURES FOR COURT USE

Arrival - when Courts are not in use

- Help yourself to the equipment in the storage cabinet (wax discs as needed)
- If courts are dirty, use the leaf blower found in storage cabinet to clear the courts
- Set-up the white board. Add your name and time you began play at top to begin a wait list
- If no one else is waiting to play, continue to play as long as you like

Arrival – when Courts are in use

- Add your name, and arrival time, to the white board list and wait in queue
- When prior players have left the court, change your time on the white board to the time you begin play (if beginning time is not noted – play will end after 10 minutes)

Time of play when others are waiting to use courts

- Limit play to the end of one (1) game or 20 minutes of play
- Limit practice shots to no more than 2 shots per player before beginning play
- Shoot promptly, 30 seconds or less between shots, to keep the game moving along

Departure – completion of play – players waiting for court

- Spray the equipment with sanitizer and erase your name from white board
- Turn equipment over to next players
- Return any equipment the next players will not be using to the storage shed

Departure – completion of play – no one waiting for court

- Spray all equipment with sanitizer and return to proper storage shed. Locked/Paid Member shed – Yellow label ed equipment Unlocked shed – Green labeled equipment. Hang cue sticks back on rack and 8 discs (4 yellow 4 black) belong in each carry basket
- Erase white board clean and return to unlocked storage shed
- Securely close both storage sheds and lock the member storage shed (on left)

GENERAL RULES OF COURTESY

- Treat others the way you would like to be treated
- Consider your time on the court when others are waiting (refer to time on whiteboard)
- Refrain from foul language
- Treat courts and equipment with care to maximize future life
- Use the handle end of the cue stick to move discs into shooting position on the court
- Offer assistance to others who may not be familiar with the equipment or procedures
- Avoid cellphone use and loud conversations which may be distracting to other players
- Refrain from eating and drinking on the courts – use the tables surrounding the courts
